Pursuant to HRS 92-7, notice is hereby given that a site visit and public hearing of the County Council's Committee on Finance will be held in order to examine physical considerations and hear public testimony regarding Resolution 169-07, Draft 2 (Comm. 349), which authorizes the Director of Finance to enter into negotiations for the acquisition of Punalu'u Beach Park, Ninole pond and adjacent lands in the District of Ka'u, pursuant to Chapter 2, Article 42, Hawai'i County Code.

The Public Hearing will convene at 4:00 p.m. at the Punalu'u Black Sand Beach Park, Pavilion #1, 96-876 Government Road, District of Ka'u, where a site visit will be held.

Notice to Lobbyists: If you are a lobbyist, you must register with the Hawai'i County Clerk within five days of becoming a lobbyist {Article 15, §2-91.3(b), Hawai'i County Code}. A lobbyist means "any individual engaged for pay or other consideration who spends more than five hours in any month or \$275 in any six-month period for the purpose of attempting to influence legislative or administrative action by communicating or urging others to communicate with public officials." {Article 15, §2-91.3(a)(6), Hawai'i County Code}.
