2-Bin Recycling: MIXED and GLASS

MIXED BIN: Paper, Cardboard, Plastics 1, 2 & 5, Metal cans

Printed on 100% post consumer recycled paper.

ALTERNATIVES

Compost organics like food, paper & green waste to reduce the frequency of using the Recycling and Transfer Stations.

Use a different Recycling and Transfer Station that is open longer hours.

Change the day that you would normally go to the Recycling and Transfer Station.

Hire a local hauler to pick-up recyclables and rubbish.

Find a neighbor or friend who is available to take recyclables and rubbish during the open hours.

Path to Zero Waste

Reduce: Try NOT to buy plastic or styrofoam

Reuse, Repair & Donate

Turn yard waste & kitchen scraps into compost

Recycle appliances & metal

Go to the website to find locations for E-waste

RECYCLING & TRANSFER STATION RULES

Residential waste and recycling only. No business or commercial use.

Do NOT put the following down the rubbish chutes:

- e-waste (electronics)
- hazardous waste
- batteries
- animals
- paint
- scrap metal
- tires

Dumping rubbish elsewhere is illegal & punishable by fines up to \$25,000.
